College applications, scholarships, future plans...oh my!

As the weather gets colder, high school seniors around the state are warming up their search for \$\$\$ to pay for their next steps in life. Hopefully you are aware by now that the US JCI Senate and the Michigan JCI Senate offer scholarships to high school seniors. This will be the 3 rd year for the trades/vocational based scholarship as well!! This is an exciting opportunity for students who might not want to attend a traditional 4- year university but also find it challenging to pay for a 2 year or certificate program (usually at a community college) However, there are some vocational programs at 4-year colleges as well. Either way, this is a scholarship specifically geared towards those students!

The US JCI Senate has added a GPA requirement of 3.75 for the traditional scholarship and 3. 25 for the vocational. Please note that the MICHIGAN JCI SENATE accepts all GPA levels for consideration of MI JCI Senate based scholarships. We would just not be able to consider moving anyone not meeting those requirements on for national consideration.





Wreaths Across America is a non-profit 501(c)3 organization with the mission to Remember and Honor our veterans, and to Teach the next generation to do so. They are most known for organizing the placement of a simple wreath with a red bow on the grave of each fallen veteran at veteran cemeteries across the United States.

The program got its start from a simple act of generosity in 1992 when the Worcester Wreath Company of Harrington, Maine had a surplus of wreaths near the end of the holiday season. Worcester Wreath decided to donate them to be placed on headstones at an older section of the Arlington National Cemetery that has less visitors. Last year, in 2022, the program and volunteers placed more than 2.7 million wreaths on the headstones of our nation's service members at 3,702 participating locations including Puerto Rico and several overseas cemeteries.

This year, the US JCI Senate is a sponsor organization with Wreaths Across America. For every two wreaths sponsored, a third will be sponsored in their name. If you would like to donate, a link below will lead you to the US JCI Senate's sponsor page where you can choose which cemetery your donation is associated with.

Additionally, the Michigan JCI Senate is forming a group to volunteer to place wreaths on the designated day of December 16. The cemetery chosen is the Michigan Veterans Cemetery in Grand Rapids.
